THE SICILIAN ECONOMY AND THE NEW FRONTIERS OF AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS THE UNIPOL GROUP PRESENTS ITS 2010 SUSTAINABILITY REPORT

CATANIA, 14 June 2011

An event held to discuss *The Sicilian Economy and the New Frontiers of Agricultural Produce* will take place at 3pm today in the Great Hall of the Faculty of Politics in Catania.

Over the past few years there has been a profound change in the way food is grown. Food production is one of the mainstays of the Sicilian economy and generally consists of traditional types of business, i.e. based on the entrepreneur, as for example in citrus-growing (50% of the total number of agricultural businesses) where most are organised as partnerships. However, cooperatives predominate in the case of other fruit-growing (45.5% of the total), whilst olive-growing is divided between individual undertakings and joint-stock companies.

Recent initiatives to obtain accreditation for the way food is grown and processed, e.g. organic certification and certification for wines, with twenty-three wines being awarded the AIS's 'five bunches' in 2011, applications from regional confederations of farmers for a 'produce of Sicily' mark are shedding a new light on the future of agriculture in Sicily, approximately thirty products being awarded DOP or IGP accreditation.

How can this trend be supported? How can tradition be combined with innovation? What will the role of the professional bodies be?

Among the contributors to the discussion will be **Elio D'Antrassi**, Sicilian Regional Councillor for Agricultural and Food Resources, **Carmelo Gurrieri**, Chairman of the CIA, **Gianluca Faraone**, Chairman of the Mediterranean Free Land Consortium, **Mario Luciano Brancato**, Chairman of MAAS, **Antonio Parrinello**, Chairman of the CTR Consortium and **Assunta D'Oronzio**, INEA Researcher.

The discussion will be chaired by **Pierluigi Stefanini**, Chairman of the Unipol Group.
